

## ❤️ The Compassion of Jesus

[Matthew 9:35](#) Then **Jesus went about** all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, **preaching** the gospel of the kingdom, **and healing** every sickness and every disease among the people.

\***Compassion – rachamim** derived from the word “rechem,” which means “womb,” symbolizing the unconditional love and tenderness associated with a mother’s care for her child. In Greek it means a “shared suffering,” emphasizing empathy and an emotional resonance with another’s pain. It conveys a desire to alleviate another’s suffering. It’s an action-oriented response. To comfort someone is a show of compassion.

Is tender hearted

[Mark 8:2](#) “I have **compassion** on the multitude, because they have now continued with Me three days and have nothing to eat.

[Isaiah 49:15](#) “Can a woman forget her nursing child, And not have **compassion** on the son of her womb? Surely they may forget, **Yet I will not forget you.**”

[Psalm 86:15](#) But You, O Lord, *are a God full of compassion*, and gracious, Longsuffering and abundant in mercy and truth.

## ❤️ The Leper ~ [Matthew 8:1-4](#)

When He had come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed Him. And behold, a leper came and worshiped Him, saying, “**Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean.**” Then Jesus put out *His* hand and touched him, saying, “I am willing; be cleansed.” Immediately his leprosy was cleansed. And Jesus said to him, “See that you tell no one; but go your way, show yourself to the priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.”

[Mark 1:40-44](#) Now a leper came to Him, imploring Him, kneeling down to Him and saying to Him, “If You are willing, You can make me clean.” Then **Jesus, moved with compassion, stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, “I am willing; be cleansed.”** As soon as He had spoken, immediately the leprosy left him, and he was cleansed. And He strictly warned him and sent him away at once, and said to him, “See that you say nothing to anyone; but go your way, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing those things which Moses commanded, as a testimony to them.”

[Luke 5:12-13](#) And it happened when He was in a certain city, that behold, a man who was **full of leprosy** saw Jesus; and he fell on *his* face and implored Him, saying, “Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean.” Then He put out *His* hand and touched him, saying, “I am willing; be cleansed.” **Immediately the leprosy left him.** And He charged him to tell no one, “But go and show yourself to the priest, and make an offering for your cleansing, as a testimony to them, just as Moses commanded.”

\***Willing - ready, eager, prompt, longing to, wanting too.**

## ❤️ What Do I Need to Believe?

A. That God really wants to heal “Me”.

[Acts 10:38](#) how God anointed **Jesus** of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who **went about doing good and healing all** who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.

B. That He has Compassion for “Me”.

[Hebrews 4:15](#) For we do not have a High Priest who cannot **sympathize with our weaknesses** (touched with the feelings of our infirmities,) but was in all *points* tempted as *we are, yet* without sin.

[Lamentations 3:22-23](#) *Through* the LORD’s mercies we are not consumed, Because His compassions fail not. *They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness.* (**compassion – mercies, faithful love, kindness**)

C. There is nothing too hard for Him to do for “Me”.

[Jeremiah 32:27](#) “Behold, I *am* the LORD, the God of all flesh. **Is there anything too hard for Me**

[Matthew 19:26](#) But Jesus looked at *them* and said to them, “**With men** this is **impossible**, BUT **with God ALL things are possible.**”
